#### Director of House League - Darryl Chalmers

- All field-based sessions due to COVID arena restrictions & capacity constraints
- Modified 6 week program (June-August)
- Largest cohorts were within the younger age groups with a focus on growing the game at the U5-U7 age levels
- Skills sessions throughout the season
- Intra-squad scrimmages within age cohorts
- Provided dry-fit t-shirts for each player with registration
- Goal of the program: to introduce new players while also developing returning players to keep them engaged and loving the sport of lacrosse.

#### Girl's Field

- First time Burlington had girls field teams playing competitively in more than a decade.
- Able to run 8-weeks of programming June through early August.
- Three age groups U9/11, U13, U15.
- Three OWFL hosted tournament weekends.
- Seven total exhibition games, including three hosted in Burlington.





#### Rep (Boy's) Field

- OMFLL season moved from usual Spring season to Fall.
- Able to run 5-weeks of programming late-August through September.
- Fielded teams in the U11 and U15 aggroups.







#### Successes

- Able to get on the field and play competitively!
- Overcame compressed planning-to-field timeline (12 days for Girls, less than a month for Boys).
- Lots of new players.
- Proved effectiveness of 2020 return to play and 2021 house league programs.







#### Goals for 2022:

- Attempt to sustain momentum.
- Rep Girls: Run teams in U9/11-U17/19.
- Boys: Restore teams in all age groups U9-U17.
- Find a way to incorporate a "try" or "house league" program.

#### Outlook to 2022:

- Build on this years success, so many first time players
  - Women's Field, Men's field & Box younger age groups (@ Coaches/Directors)
- Work on rebuilding our Girls Box program
  - Off set girls Box and Field times to allow for more players to do both
  - Bring back the girls only learn-2-play program for Box
- Coaches/Trainers: Registration & Certifications
  - Better communication to get them registered & approved before season starts
- Try-Lax Program should Open latest Jan 1/22
  - Open up program as soon as able, get more kids to try it and bring a friend



# Financial Report Jamie Sproat

#### **INCOME & EXPENSES**

- Grants
  - \$7,500 Jump Start
  - \$1,790 TRAC
  - o \$1,500 OLA
  - \$1,000 Zone 9
- Bank fees significantly lower thanks to Credits and E-Transfers
- OLA fees:
  - 2020 OLA Fees restated to reflect refund of \$3,388. Original estimate was \$2,150
- Surplus of \$20k helps recover losses over 2020. Grants are almost 60% of the profit.
- Bank balance now greater than Deferred Revenue

#### **BALANCE SHEET**

- Most 2020 Inventory was used in 2021. Only items remaining are Rep Box Apparel
- Deferred Revenue Registrations left with BMLA. Reduce substantially, but still a lot left. Thank you to everyone who elected to leave their credits
- Significant improvement to Equity
  - Robust Programs across all sectors
  - Grants

# SHANNON-MIOTTO GIRLS LACROSSE COACHES AWARD

### President



- Chair all Association, Executive, Board, Annual General and Special Meetings
- Oversee all the Association's business to see that it is conducted as directed by the Board, and report actions at the following meeting.
- Represent the Association at the Annual Meeting of the Ontario Lacrosse Association
- Be the main contact person for all matters dealing with the Ontario Lacrosse Association
- Be an ex-officio member of any committee formed for any purpose
- Have the power, subject to approval of the Executive Officers, to replace an elected or appointed member who, in the opinion of the Executive Officers, has not been fulfilling his or her duties adequately
- Be a signing officer of the BMLA to pay pre-approved budgeted expenses by the Executive Officers
- Work with the Vice President of Lacrosse to ensure that they are prepared to take the president role the following year Make reasonable attempt to assist at all BMLA sponsored events i.e., Tournaments, Minor Lacrosse Weekend, Banquets, Registration, etc.
- Keep the General Executive informed of all developments and situations within the association
- Inform any players, coach or any other person associated with BMLA activities of any observed code of conduct infraction of any CLA, OLA, OMFLL, OWFL, BMLA or affiliate league
- In conjunction with the Secretary, devise and prepare an agenda for circulation to the Board of Directors in advance of the next meeting.
- Act as a liaison between the BMLA and junior lacrosse programs in the Halton Region In cases requiring immediate action, the
  President may take action with or without reference to the Board of Directors, but shall be responsible for the action to the
  Board of Directors at the next meeting of the Board

### VP House League



Obtain convenors for each division of the House League

- Settle any disputes concerning House League teams
- Refer any disputes requiring further action to the Disciplinary committee
- Distribute bulletins of concern to conveners for delivery to the coaches and managers of all House League teams
- Work with conveners at all levels to ensure House League teams are balanced prior to a date to be set by the board
- Approve all rosters before the commencement of all playoff series games
- Ensure that conveners pick up and retain all House League game sheets and forward the results to yourself and the Publicity Director on a weekly basis
- Review game sheets and bring any unusual circumstances to the attention of the Board

- By Feb 1st of each year, the VP House League, with the assistance of the Technical Director, shall be responsible for the preparation and review of policy and procedures manuals for the House League Lacrosse program.
- Ensure that all equipment is collected at the end of the season and returned to the Equipment Director
- Make reasonable attempt to assist at all BMLA sponsored events i.e., Tournaments, Minor Lacrosse Weekend, Banquets, Registration, etc.
- Inform any players, coach, manager or any person associated with BMLA activities of any observed code of conduct infraction of any CLA, OLA, OMFLL, OWFL, BMLA or affiliated league rule
- Keep the President informed of all developments and situations within the association
- Any other duties as assigned by the Executive Officers

### **VP Field Lacrosse**

- Be the representative at the OMFLL meetings for BMLA
- Act as the OMFLL convenor for home hosting
- Be the OMFLL point of contact for the field season
- Ensure all players and cards are in compliance to OMFLL regulations
- Settle any minor disputes involving Field teams
- Refer any incidents requiring further action to the Disciplinary Committee
- Ensure that all Field coaches receive bulletins and notices from the BMLA, the OLA and the OMFLL and the CLA
- By Feb 1st of each year, the Director of Boys Field, with the assistance of the Technical Director, shall be responsible for the preparation and review of policy and procedures manuals for the Boys Field Lacrosse program
- Ensure that all equipment is collected at the end of the season and returned to the equipment director
- Make reasonable attempt to assist at all BMLA sponsored events i.e., Tournaments, Minor Lacrosse Weekend, Banquets, Registration, etc.
- Inform any players, coach, manager or any person associated with BMLA activities of any observed code of conduct infraction of any CLA, OLA, OMFLL, OWFL, BMLA or affiliated league rule
- Keep the President informed of all developments and situations within the association
- Any other duties as assigned by the Executive Officers
